- Concert royal** [Fr for Royal concert; → *Concerts royaux*] Milhaud: conc for violin + orch n.3, op.373 (1958), based on Elisabeth, queen of Belgium (1876-1965).
- Concerts à deux violes esgales** [old Fr for (literally) Concerts for two equal viols] Sainte-Colombe: 67 pieces for 2 viols (c1685).
- Concert sans orchestre** [Fr for Concert without orchestra] Schumann: son for piano n.3, in f, op.14 (1835-36).
- Concerts de symphonies** [Fr for Concerts of symphonies] Dauvergne: 2 sets: 2 suites for 2 violins + viola + double bass, op.3 (1751) + 2 suites for 2 violins + viola + double bass, op.4 (1751).
- Concerts en sextuor** [Fr for Sextet concerts; titles of mov portraying fictional or real women of the time] Rameau: arrangement for str of the 5 suites of *Pièces de clavecin en concert*, with addition of a 6th suite (1741); 1. La Coulicam; La Livri; La Vézinet; 2. La Laborde; La Boucon; L'Agaçante; Menuet (1 + 2); 3. La Pouplinière; La timide; Tambourin (1 + 2); 4. La Pantomime; L'indiscrète; La Rameau; 5. La Forqueray; La Cupis; La Marais; 6. La poule (The hen); Menuet (1 + 2); L'Enharmonique; L'Égyptienne.
- Concerts royaux** [Fr for Royal concerts; based on *Louis XIV; → *Concert royal*] F Couperin: 4 pieces, for harpsichord + str + wind + narrator (1714-15); → *Nouveaux concerts des goûts réunis*.
- Concertstück** [→ *Konzertstück*; Ger for Concert piece; equivalent to *concerto*, for orch + 1instr (or several instr) as solo parts]
- Chaminade: for piano + orch, op.40 (1896). ■Lazzari: for piano + orch (1894).
 - Pierné: for harp + orch, in G♯, op.39 (1901).
 - Rimsky-Korsakov: for clarinet + band, in E♭ (1878).
 - A Rubinstein: → *Konzertstück*.
 - Schumann: for 4 horns + orch, in F, op.86 (1849).
 - CMv Weber: → *Konzertstück*.
- Concert Suite** [as a concerto] Elwell: for violin + orch (1957).
- Concert Variations on the Star Spangled Banner** → *Festival Overture on the American National Air, The Star Spangled Banner*.
- Concert Variations upon an English Theme** [tune is *Down Among the Dead Men* from *Popular Music of the Olden Time* by William *Chappell] Stanford: for piano + orch, op.71 (1898), dedicated to Borwick.
- Concert waltzes** → *Valses de concert*.
- Conchita** [char in novel *La femme et le pantin* (Fr for The woman and the puppet) (1898) by *Louÿs] Zandonai: opera 4a (1911), lib by Maurice *Vaucaire (in Fr), translated in Ital by *Zangarini.
- Concierto** → *Concerto* + following specific titles.
- Concierto andaluz** [Span for Andalusian concerto; → (Ital) *Concerto andaluso*] Rodrigo: 3mov for 4 guitars + orch (1967).
- Concierto argentino** [Span for Argentine concerto] Ginastera: conc for piano + orch n.1 (1961).
- Concierto breve** [Span for Short concerto; → (Ital) *Concerto breve*] Montsalvatge: for piano + orch (1953).
- Concierto como un divertimento** [Span for Concerto as a divertimento] Rodrigo: for cello + orch (1980).
- Concierto de Aranjuez** [Span for Concerto of Aranjuez, site of royal summer palace, near *Madrid (Spain)] Rodrigo: for guitar + orch, in D (1939); dedicated to Yépes; arranged for harp + orch (1974); → *Aranjuez, ma pensée*.
- Concierto de cámara** [Span for *Chamber concerto; → (Ital) *Concerto da camera*] Pablo: for piano + small ens (1978).
- Concierto de Castilla** [Span for Castilian concerto] Moreno-Torroba: 3mov for guitar + orch (1959).
- Concierto de estío** [Span for Summer concerto; → (Ital) *Concerto dell'estate*] Rodrigo: for violin + orch (1943).
- Concierto de Helsinki** [Span for Concerto of Helsinki, capital city of Finland] L Brouwer: conc for guitar + orch n.5 (1991).
- Concierto de Lieja** [Span for Concerto of Liege, city in Belgium] L Brouwer: conc for guitar + orch n.2 (1987).
- Concierto del Sur** [Span for Southern concerto] Ponce: for guitar + orch (1941), dedicated to Segovia.
- Concierto de Toronto** [Span for Concerto of Toronto, city in Canada] L Brouwer: conc for guitar + orch n.4 (1987).
- Concierto elegíaco** [Span for Elegiac concerto] L Brouwer: conc for guitar + orch n.3 (1986).
- Concierto en flamenco** [Span for Concerto in the flamenco style; → *Concierto flamenco*] Moreno-Torroba: for guitar + orch (1962).
- Concierto en modo galante** [Span for Concerto in a gallant mode] Rodrigo: for cello + orch (1949).
- Concierto fantástico** [Span for Fantastic concerto] Albéniz: conc n.1 for piano + orch, in a, op.78 (1887).
- Concierto galante** → *Concierto en modo galante*.
- Concierto heroico** [Span for Heroic concerto; → (Ital) *Concerto eroico*] Rodrigo: for piano + orch (1942).
- Concierto levantino** [Span for Levantine concerto] Palau: for guitar + orch (1948).
- Concierto madrigal** [Span for Madrigal concerto] Rodrigo: for 2 guitars + orch (1968), based on anonymous Renaissance madrigal *Felices ojos míos* (Span for Happy eyes of mine).
- Concierto para una fiesta** [Span for Concerto for a party; commissioned for two debutantes in Texas (US)] Rodrigo: for guitar + orch (1983).
- Concierto pastoral** [Span for Pastoral concerto] Rodrigo: for flute + orch (1978).
- Concierto serenata (para arpa y orquesta)** [Span for Serenade concerto (for harp and orchestra)] Rodrigo: for harp + orch (1954); 1. Estudiantina; 2. Intermezzo con aria; 3. Sarao (Span for Social gathering, or soirée).
- Concierto vasco** [Span for Basque concerto] Escudero: for piano + orch (1946).
- Concord (Sonata)** [inspired by American writers in city of Concord, Massachusetts (US)] Ives: full title *Sonata No. 2 - Concord, Massachusetts, 1840-1860*, son 4mov for piano n.2, with viola + flute, Kx19 (1910-15, revised 1921); 1. Emerson; 2. Hawthorne; 3. The Alcotts; 4. Thoreau (with obbligato flute); each mov quotes opening of **Eroica Symphony* by Beethoven; arranged for orchestra as *Concord Symphony* (1996) by Brant.
- Concordanza** [Ital for Concordance] Gubaïdulina: for chamber ens (1971).
- Concordia** [based on Concordia University, in Montreal (Canada)] Brott: for orch (1946).
- The Condemned Playground** [title of set of essays by Connolly; text from different poets (in parentheses)] Gideon: 3 songs for soprano + tenor + chamber ens (1963); 1. Pyrrha (*Horace, translated in English by *Milton); 2. Hiroshima (Spokes); 3. Litanies of Satan (*Baudelaire, translated in English by *Millay).
- Condor** [main char in story] Gomes: opera (azione lirica) 3a (1890), lib in Ital by Canti.
- La confederazione** [Ital for The confederation] Boccherini: opera (1765).
- La conférence des oiseaux** [Fr for The conference (or “parlement”) of the birds; based on poem by Attar] Levinas: chamber opera, for soprano + narrator + ens + tape (1985).
- Confession** [based on *Musset] Denisov: ballet (1984).
- The Confession of Isobel Gowdie** [based on legendary Scottish witch] J MacMillan: for orch (1990).
- The Confidence-Man** [based on novel *The Confidence-Man: His Masquerade* (1857) by *Melville] Rochberg: opera (1st) 2a (1982), lib by G Rochberg.
- Configuration** [→ *Configurations*] Barati: for large orch (c1946).
- Configurations** [→ *Configuration*+(Ger) *Konfigurationen*] W Kraft: for 4perc + jazz orch (1966).
- Confinement** [referring to restraints in music and in the mind] Harbison: for 12instr (1965).
- Confitebor tibi, Domine** [Lain for I will praise the Lord; psalms 110L (111E) + 137L (138E); → *Psalmi*] ■JC Bach: for SATB + orch (1759).
- Blanchard: motet (1744).
 - Lalande: for soprano + treble + countertenor + tenor + bass + choir + orch, S56 (1697).
 - Vivaldi: psalm 110L, in C, RV596 (c1712-17).
 - Wesley: motet for 4 voices + orch (1799).
- Confitemini Domino** [Latin for O give thanks unto the Lord; psalms 135L (136E) + 117L (118E) + 104L (105E); → *Psalmi*] Lalande: for choir + orch (1705).
- Conflicts** [between two themes] Leighton: *Fantasy on Two Themes*, for
