**Abegg Variations** [based on notes A B♭ E G G, dedicated “à Mlle Pauline, Comtesse d'Abegg”, to the composer's, perhaps imagined, friend (Countess) Meta Abegg; + → *Notation letters and syllables*] Schumann: theme + var for piano, op.1 (1830).

**Les abeilles** [Fr for The bees] F Couperin: original title *L'abeille*, piece (rondeau) for harpsichord, ordre 1/9, in g, vol.1 (1713).

**Abeja blanca** [Span for White bee, poem by \*Neruda] Welcher: for mezzo + Eng horn + piano (1979).

**Abelard and Heloise** [→ Index of names (Abélard + Héloïse)] Ward: opera (5<sup>th</sup>) 3a (1981), lib by Hartman.

**Les Abencérages** [Fr for The Abencerrages (Moorish Abenceragi warriors)] Cherubini: subtitle *L'étendard de Grenade* (The Standard of Granada), opera (tragédie lyrique) 3a (1813), lib by \*Jouy, based on novel *Gonzalve de Cordoue ou Grenade reconquise* (1791) by \*Florian; → *Zoraida di Granata*.

**Abendempfindung** [Ger for Evening mood] Mozart: song for soprano + piano, K523 (1787), lyrics by Campe.

**Abendlied** [Ger for Evening song] ■ Rheinberger: *Evensong*, for unac mixed choir, op.69/3 (1855), with text from Bible (Luke 24:29). ■ Schumann: for piano 4 hands, op.85/12 (c1849).

**Der Abenteurer** [Ger for The adventurer] Bittner: opera 4a (1912), lib by composer.

**Abertura concertante** [Portuguese for Concertante overture] Guarnieri: for orch (1942).

**Aberystwyth** [town in Wales; text from *Hymns and Sacred Poems* (1740) by C Wesley] Joseph Parry: hymn tune (1877).

**Abide with me** [text (1820) by Lyte] Monk: subtitle *Eventide*, hymn for voices + organ, published in *Hymns Ancient and Modern* (1861); → *Hymn-tune Preludes*.

**Les abîmes du rêve** [Fr for The depths of dream, based on poem by \*Nelligan] Hétu: song for bass + orch, op.36 (1982).

**Abodah** [Jewish prayer] E Bloch: subtitle *A Yom Kippur Melody*, for violin + piano (1929).

**Abongo** [name of tribe in Gabon (Africa)] Camilleri: for wind qnt (1970).

**Abracadabra** [incantation word; also, nonsense] Freedman: opera (1979).

**Abraham** [biblical char (Genesis)+ → *Cave* + titles below] ■ Harbison: motet for brass + voices (2004). ■ Molique: oratorio (1861).

**Abraham and Isaac** [biblical char (Genesis 22:2); → (Ital) *Abramo ed Isacco*] ■ Britten: → *Canticles* (II). ■ Stravinsky: subtitle *A Sacred Ballad*, for baritone + chamber ens (1962-63), text in Hebrew, dedicated to the people of the State of Israel.

**Abraham et l'ange** [Fr for Abraham and the angel, based on Bible (Genesis 22:11)] Delamnoy: “total show”, or dramatic synthesis, for voices + narrator + dancers + orch (1957).

**Abraham Lincoln** [→ Index of names (Lincoln)] RoR Bennett: subtitle *A Likeness in Symphony Form*, symph 4mov for orch (1929); 1. His Simplicity and His Sadness; 2. His Affection and His Faith; 3. His

- Abraxas** [or “Abrasax”, name of Greek deity; based on poem *Der Doktor Faust* (1847) by \*Heine] Egk: ballet 5sc (1947), lib by composer, choreog by Charrat.
- Die Abreise** [Ger for The departure; based on play (1813) by Steigentesch; [→(Fr) *Départ*] J d’Albert: comic opera 1a (1898), lib by \*Sporck.
- Abschied** →*Abschiedssymphonie + Lied von der Erde* (n.6).
- Abschied von meinem Silbermannischen Claviere, in einem Rondo** [Ger for Farewell to my Silbermann keyboard, in one rondo; → Index of names (Silbermann)] CPE Bach: for piano, in e, W66 (c1781).
- Abschiedssymphonie** [Ger for Farewell Symphony; in final mov.4, musicians leave in turn, to end the piece with only two of them; →*Ankunftssinfonie*] FJ Haydn: symph n.45, in f#, H.I/45 (1772); →*As Time Goes By + Farewell to Philosophy + Sturm und Drang*.
- L’absent** [Fr for The absent one] ■Fauré: song for voice + piano, op.5/3 (1871), poem (1853) by \*Hugo. ■Gounod: song (1877), text by composer.
- The Absent-minded Man** →(Ital) *distratto*.
- Absolute Jest** [in “scherzo” style, with references to music of Beethoven] Adams: for str qrt + orch (2013).

- Abysses, bridges, chasms** [initial letters of nouns in title following A, B, C pattern] Keyes: for 10 jazz instr + orch (1971).
- Academic Festival Overture** →(Ger) *Akademische Fest-Ouvertüre*.
- Academic Graffiti** [book of clerihews (1971) by \*Auden, illustrated by Sanjust] Smit: for voice + clarinet + cello + piano + perc (1959).
- Academic March** [Eng for Finnish *Promootiomarsssi*] Sibelius: for orch, without opus number (1919).
- Academic Sonatas** →(Ital) *Sonate accademiche*.
- Acadian Songs and Dances** →*Louisiana Story* (n.2).
- Acanthe et Céphise** [Fr for Greek myth char Acanthus + Cephissus] Rameau: subtitle *La sympathie*, opera (pastorale héroïque) 3a (1751), lib by \*Marmontel.
- A cappella** [short form for “alla cappella”, Ital for In the style of chapel music, meaning singing without instr accompaniment] Gould: 2 songs for choir (1988); 1. Tolling; 2. Solfegging.
- Acceleration Waltz** [Eng for Ger *Accelerationen*] JJ Strauss: for piano or orch, op.234 (1860).
- Acceptit Jesus calicem** [Latin for Jesus took the cup, based on Bible (Matthew 26:27)] Palestrina: motet 6pt (1575).
- Acclamations** [→(Span) *Aclamaciones*] Waldteufel: subtitle *Hoch lebe der Tanz!* (Ger for Let the dance live!), waltz for orch, op.223 (1888).
- Accompaniment Music to a Film Scene** →(Ger) *Begleitmusik zu einer Lichtspielszene*.
- Accompaniments** [with pianist singing or declaiming text while playing] C Wolff: piece 4pt for piano (1972).
- Gli accordi più usati** [Ital for The most-often used chords] Harbison: for orch (1993).
- L’accueil des muses** [Fr for The Muses’ welcome] Roussel: for piano (1920), in memory of Debussy.
- The Accursed Huntsman** →(Fr) *chasseur maudit*.

- Acis, Galatea e Polifemo** [Ital for Greek myth char Acis, Galatea and Poliphemos] Handel: dramatic cantata, HWV72 (1708).
- Acis and Galatea** [Greek myth char; char in *Metamorphoses XIII* by \*Ovid; →*Galathée + Poliphème*; + → titles above and below] Handel: title in first edition *Songs and Symphony’s*, dramatic cantata (masque) 1a, for soprano + tenor + bass + choir + orch, HWV49 (1718), lib presumably by J \*Gay + \*Pope + J Hughes; revised 3a (1732).
- Acis et Galatée** [Fr for Greek myth char \**Acis and Galatea*; →*Galatée*] ■MA Charpentier: opera 2a (1678). ■Lully: opera (pastorale héroïque) prol + 3a (1686), lib by \*Campistron.

- Acquaintances** [with titles of mov starting with letter “a”] Reynolds: 3mov for flute + double bass + piano (1963); 1. Abrupt; 2. Antic; 3. Acceptance.
- Acrobats** →*saltimbanques*.
- Acrobats of God** [describing the dancers] Surinach: ballet 1a (1960), choreog by M \*Graham.
- Acrostic Song** →*Final Alice*.
- Actéon** [Fr for Roman + Greek myth char Actaeon; →*Diane et Actéon + Metamorphoses Symphonies* (n.3)] ■Alessandrescu: symph poem (1915). ■Auber: comic opera 1a (1840), lib by \*Scribe. ■Aubin: cantata for soprano + tenor + bass + orch (1930). ■MA Charpentier: subtitle *Opéra de chasse*, opera (pastorale) 1a (6sc), H481 (1683-85).
- Action Music** [referring to vigorous way of playing requested by composer] Scelsi: 9 pieces for piano (1955).
- Action, Passion, Illusion** [separate pieces, grouped as a set] Tüür: 3 pieces for str (1993).
- Actions for Six** [for 6instr] Rands: for flute + viola + cello + harp + 2perc (1963).
- Action-situation-signification** [a blend of “action” of the musicians and “situation” of recorded natural sounds, and “signification” of the whole] Lindberg: for horn + perc + cello + piano + tape (1982).
- Two Acts for Three Players** [describing number of instr] Finney: for

- piano + clarinet + perc (1975).
- Acts of God** →*Atalanta* (Ashley).
- Actus tragicus** [Latin for The tragic act] →*Bach's cantatas* (BWV106).
- Aculoé** [laguna region in Chile] Letelier: suite for orch, op.17 (1956).
- Acustica** [Ital for Acoustics] Kagel: 3 pieces for tape + 3-5instr (1968-70).
- Adagietto** [Ital for Small adagio, meaning at a slightly faster pace than adagio; word used as a title for mov of larger works, rarely as a title for a complete work; incl following] ■Mahler: title of popular mov.4, for str + harp, in F, of symph n.5, in c♯ (1901-02). ■Penderecki: →*Paradise Lost*.
- Adagio** [from the Ital "ad agio" meaning at ease, at a slow pace; word used as a title for many slow pieces or mov of larger works, by itself (Adagio for such instr or orch, or in such key...); or with other mov titles (Adagio and Allegro, Adagio and Rondo...); incl following] ■Albinoni: →*Adagio for strings and organ*. ■Barber: →*Adagio for Strings*. ■Heininen: subtitle *Concerto per orchestra in forma di variazioni*, for large orch (1966). ■Khachaturian: →*Spartacus*. ■Pärt: for violin + cello + piano (1992).
- Adagio appassionato** [Ital for Passionate adagio] Bruch: for violin + orch, in f, op.57 (1890).
- Adagio canonique** [Fr for Canon adagio] Mozart: for 2 bassoon horns + bassoon, in F, K410 (1782).
- Adagio celeste** [Ital for Heavenly adagio] Rautavaara: for small orch (1997, revised 2000), based on poem by Nummi.
- Adagio con variazioni** [Ital for Adagio with variations] Respighi: for cello + orch, P133 (originally for piano + cello) (1920).
- Adagio et Rondo de société** [Fr for Adagio and society rondo] Hummel: for piano + orch, op.117 (1829).
- Adagio et Stretto** [Fr for Adagio and stretto] Amy: for orch (1978).
- Adagio for strings** [→*Adagio*] Barber: arrangement for str orch (1938) of mov.2 of str qrt n.1, in b, op.11 (1936); + arranged by composer as *Agnus Dei* for choir (+ organ) (1967).
- Adagio for strings and organ** [describing instruments used] Albinoni: piece in g, attributed to Albinoni, in fact composed (1945) by Giazotto (→ Index of names), based on music by Albinoni.
- Adagio Hammerklavier** [Ital + Ger for Adagio + pianoforte] ballet 1a (1973), based on mov.3 *Adagio sostenuto* of \**Hammerklavier Sonata* by Beethoven, choreog by \*Manen.
- Adagio lyrico** [Ital + Eng for Lyric adagio] Downey: for 2 pianos (1953).
- Adagio on Celtic Themes** [Eng for Ger *Adagio nach keltischen Motiven*] Bruch: for cello + orch, in e + E, op.56 (1890).
- Adagio tenebroso** [Ital for Dark adagio] Carter: for orch (1994).
- Adagio tragico** [Ital for Tragic adagio] Sinigaglia: for str (or str qrt), op.21 (1901).
- Adagissimo** [Ital for Extremely slow] Ferneyhough: for str qrt (1983).
- Adam de la Halle** [→ Index of composers; based on text by \*Heyse] Frank: comic opera 2a (1880), lib by \*Mosenthal.
- Adam in der Klemme** [Ger for (literally) Adam in difficulties] Diabelli: comic opera (1809).
- Adam und Eva** [Ger for biblical char Adam and Eve (Genesis)] Theile: subtitle *Der erschaffene, gefallene und aufgerichtete Mensch* (Ger for The creation, the fall and the redemption of Man), opera (biblisch Singspiel - biblical musical comedy) prol + 2a (1678), lib by C Richter; in Fr *Adam et Ève, ou la Création, la Chute et le Relèvement de l'Homme*.
- Adam Zero** [about rise and fall of man] Bliss: ballet 1a (16sc) (1946), scenario by \*Benthall, choreog by \*Helpmann.
- Addio** [Ital for \*Good-bye] Tosti: popular song (1880).
- Addio Garibaldi** [Ital for Good-bye Garibaldi; → Index of names (Garibaldi)] Arrigo: opera 2pt (1972), lib by composer.
- Adelaïde** [poem (published 1794) by \*Matthison; → (Fr) *Adélaïde*] ■Beethoven: song for baritone + piano, op.46 (1795), dedicated to Matthisson.
- Adélaïde** [→*Adelaïde*] M Casadesus: conc for violin + orch, in D (published 1931); formerly attributed to Mozart, as K.Anhang 294a (1766); supposedly dedicated to Fr princess Adélaïde (1732-1800).
- Adelaide di Borgogna** [Ital for historical char Adelaide of Burgundy,
- (931-999), wife of \**Lotario*] Rossini: subtitle *Ottone, re d'Italia* (Otto, king of Italy), opera (23<sup>rd</sup>) 2a (1817), lib by GF \*Schmidt.
- Adélaïde, ou le langage des fleurs** [Fr for *Adelaide*, or The language of flowers] Ravel: ballet (1912), based on version for orch of \**Valses nobles et sentimentales*.
- De ädelmodiga bönderna** [Swedish for The noble peasant] Dupuy: opera 1sc (1797).
- Adelson e Salvini** [Ital for Adelson and Salvini; play in Fr *Adelson et Salvini*, published in collection *Les épreuves du sentiment* (1772-81) by \*Baculard d'Arnaud] Bellini: opera (opera semiseria) (1<sup>st</sup>) 3a (revised with 2a) (1825-26), lib by \*Tottola.
- Adelwold und Emma** [Ger for Adelwold and Emma] Schubert: song for voice + piano, D211 (1815).
- Adeste fideles** [Latin title (Come, faithful ones) of hymn published in Eng as *O come, all ye faithful*, for Christmas time; →*Symphonie-Passion + Weihnachtsbaum* (n.4)] Wade: hymn for voices (c1740-43), text by composer.
- Adiemus** [close to Latin *audiamus* (Let us hear)] Jenkins: subtitle *Songs of Sanctuary*, for soprano + choir + orch (1994).
- Adieu** [Fr for \*Good-bye] ■Chopin: →*Valse de l'adieu*. ■C Halffter: for harpsichord (1978). ■Lazarof: for clarinet + piano (1974).
- Adieu à Guillaume Kolberg** [Fr for Farewell to (composer's friend) Wilhelm (Karol Adolf) Kolberg (1807-1877)] Chopin: polonaise for piano, in b♭ (1826, published posth 1855); uses theme from *La gazza ladra* by Rossini.
- L'adieu à Varsovie** [Fr for Farewell to Warsaw] Chopin: rondo for piano, in c, op.1 (1825); title given (1836) by an English publisher.
- Adieu ces bons vins de Lannoys** [Fr for Farewell to the good wines of the region of Laon (France)] Dufay: song (rondeau) for voice + harpsichord (c1426).
- L'adieu des bergers** →*enfance du Christ* (n.2).
- Adieu, New York** [based on city of \*New York (US)] Auric: fox-trot, for piano (1919).
- Adieu, Robert Schumann** [based on (composer) Schumann] Schafer: for mezzo + orch (1976).
- Adieu, sweet Amaryllis** [Fr for Good-bye, sweet Amaryllis] Wilbye: madrigal for 4 voices (1598).
- Adieu to the piano** [Fr for Good-bye to the piano] anonymous: waltz for piano, in F (published 1838), wrongly attributed to Beethoven.
- Les adieux** [Fr for The farewell; →*adieux, l'absence et le retour + Farewell* (Dussek)] Hummel: subtitle *Grand Piano Concerto*, for piano + orch, in E, op.110 (1814).
- Adieux de Wotan** →*Walküre*.
- Les adieux, l'absence et le retour** [Fr for Farewell, absence and return] Beethoven: full title *Sonate caractéristique; les adieux, l'absence et le retour* (Characteristic sonata; Farewell, absence and return), aka *Farewell Sonata*; title given by publisher to son for piano n.26, in E♭, op.81a (1810); 3mov, with the successive titles (*Lebewohl, Abwesenheit, Wiedersehen*); Beethoven would have preferred the title *Das Lebewohl* (The farewell); dedicated to Archduke \*Rudolph.
- Adina** [inspired by theme of abduction from seraglio] Rossini: subtitle *Il califfo di Bagdad*, opera (25<sup>th</sup>) 1a (1818), lib by \*Bevilacqua-Aldobrandini.
- Adjustable Wrench** [based on riff by Benitez] Torke: for chamber ens (1987).
- Admeto, re di Tessaglia** [Ital for Greek myth char Admetus, king of Thessaly, husband of \*Alcestis; + play by \*Euripides] Handel: opera 3a, HWV22 (1726), lib by Mauro, adapted by \*Haym (and \*Rolli), based on lib *L'Antigona delusa da Alceste* (Antigone deluded by Alcestis) (1660) by \*Aureli (→*Alceste*).
