

- Janáček: or *The Musician's Child*, symph poem (1912).
- Fiddler's Jig** [in reverence to Grainger] Cowell: subtitle *Flirtatious Jig*, for violin + str (1952).
- The Fiddlers** → *Fiddler* + (Finnish) *Pelimannit*.
- A Fiddler's Tale** [inspired by **Histoire du soldat* ("A Soldier's Tale") by Stravinsky] Marsalís: for narrator + septet (1998).
- Der fidele Bauer** [Ger for The merry peasant] Fall: operetta 3a (1907), lib by *Léon; act1: The student; act2: The doctor; act3: The professor.
- Fidelio** [based on Fr drama *Léonore ou L'amour conjugal* (Fr for Leonore or Conjugal Love) by *Bouilly; → *amor coniugale* + *Leonore* 40/45] Beethoven: subtitle *Die eheliche Liebe* (Ger for Wedded love), or *Der Triumph der ehelichen Liebe* (Ger for The triumph of wedded love), original title *Leonora*, opera (Singspiel) 2a (19sc) (originally 3a), op.72 (1805, revised 1806 + 1814), lib by *Sonneleithner + *Treitschke + Breuning; 4 versions of the ov, all in C, named Leonora n.1 (never used as such), Leonora n.2 (1805), Leonora n.3 (1806) + Fidelio (1814); → *Album für die Jugend* (n.21).
- Fidicinium sacro-profanum** [Latin for (literally) The playing of sacred and secular music on the lute] Biber: 12son for str (1683).
- Fieber** [Ger for Fever] Lehár: symph poem for tenor + orch (1915).
- Fiedellieder** [Ger for Fiddle songs] Krenek: for voice + piano, op.64 (1930).
- Field Figures** [based on music by Stockhausen] ballet 1a (1971), choreog by *Tetley.
- Field Marshal Death** → *Songs and Dances of Death* (n.4).
- Field Mass** [Eng for Czech *Polní mše*; → *Variations on a theme* by ... (Bohuslav) Martinů] Martinů: aka *Military Mass*, cantata for baritone + male choir + wind + brass + perc, H279 (1939).
- The Fields and Forests of Bohemia** → *Má vlast* (n.4).
- The Fields of Sorrow** [text from Greek myth char Ausonius, char in poem *Aeneid* (29-19BC) by *Virgil] Birtwistle: for 2 sopranos + mixed choir + 16instr (1971).
- La fiera di Venezia** [Ital for The fair in Venice; → *Venezia*] Salieri: opera buffa 3a (1772), lib by G *Boccherini.
- Fierabras** [from Span Fierabrás (The braggart)] Schubert: opera (heroisch-romantische Oper) 3a, D796 (1823), lib by *Kupelwieser, based on play *El puente de Mantible* (1630) by *Calderón de la Barca, based on *Spanisches Theater* by A *Schlegel.
- The Fiery Angel** → (Russian) *Ognenniy angel*.
- Fiesque** [play (1824) by *Ancelot, based on play *Die Verschwörung des Fiesko zu Genoa* (Ger for Fiesco, or The Genoese Conspiracy) (1783) by *Schiller] Lalo: opera 3a (1866), lib by Beauquier.
- Fiesta** [Span for Festivity] C Williams: symph dance n.3, for wind ens (1967).
- Fiesta del Pacífico** [Span for Pacific festival] Nixon: for symph band (1959).
- La fiesta mexicana** [Span for The Mexican fair] O Reed: subtitle *A Mexican Folk Song Symphony*, 3mov for wind + hp + perc (1949); arranged for orch (1964); 1. Prelude and Aztec Dance; 2. Mass; 3. Carnival.
- Fifi** → *Mademoiselle Fifi*.
- Fifine at the Fair** [poem (1872) by R *Browning] Bantock: subtitle *A Defence of Inconstancy, Orchestral Drama*, symph poem n.3 (1901).
- Fifteen Pieces for Harp** [for solo harp] Weinzweig: 15 pieces for solo harp (1983); 1. Shadows; 2. Quick March; 3. Reverie; 4. Quarks; 5. Just Dreamin'; 6. Fine Time; 7. Bluenote; 8. Around and Around; 9. Arioso; 10. Why not?; 11. Do you remember?; 12. Echoes; 13. All these Woes!; 14. Conversation; 15. Satellite Serenade.
- Fifteen Prints after Dürer's Apocalypse** [Eng for Czech *Patnáct listů podle Dürerovy Apokalypy*; → Index of names (Dürer)] Fišer: for orch (1965).
- Fifths** → *Quinten*.
- Fifty Million Frenchmen** [inspired by song *Fifty Million Frenchmen Can't Be Wrong* (1927) by B *Rose] C Porter: operetta prol + 2a (10sc) (1929), lib by H *Fields, lyrics by composer.
- Figaro** → *nozze di Figaro*.
- Figaro lässt sich scheiden** [Ger for Figaro seeks a divorce, play (1936) by *Horvath, composed as sequel to *The Marriage of Figaro*] Klebe: opera 2a (9sc) (1964), lib by composer.
- Figaro Quartet** [based on themes from opera *Le *nozze di Figaro* by Mozart] Danzi: str qrt, op.6/2 (1790).
- La figlia del reggimento** [Ital for The Daughter of the Regiment; → *Grande fantaisie militaire*] Donizetti: comic opera 2a (1840), lib by JH *Saint-Georges + Bayard; 1st performance in Fr as *La fille du régiment*.
- La figlia di Jorio** [Ital for The daughter of Joris; play 3a (1904) by *Annunzio] ■ Franchetti: opera 3a (1906). ■ Pizzetti: opera (pastoral tragedy) 3a (1953), lib by composer.
- Il figliuol prodigo** [Ital for The **Prodigal Son*] ■ Ponchielli: opera 4a (1880), lib by *Zanardini. ■ Schürer: oratorio (azione sacra) (1747), lib by *Pasquini.
- Figments** [with dissonances] Kolb: for flute + piano (1966, revised 1969).
- Figure humaine** [Fr for Human face, based on 7 poems by *Éluard + *Apollinaire] Poulenc: cantata for 2unac mixed choir (1943).
- Figures** for titles including figures (digits) → *Numbers*.
- Figures de résonances** [Fr for (literally) Shapes of resonances] Dutilleux: for 2 pianos (1970).
- Figures, Doubles, Prisms** [Fr for Figures, Doubles, Prisms] Boulez: for orch (1958, revised 1964-68).
- La fileuse** [Fr for The spinner] ■ Balakirev: for piano, in B♭ (1906). ■ Fauré: → *Pelléas et Mélisande* (n.2). ■ Raff: for piano, op.157/2 (1870).
- Les fileuses de Transylvanie** → *Székely fonó*.
- Fili** [Ital for Threads] Donatoni: for flute + piano (1981).
- Filigree Setting** [in a serialist style; → *Settings*] Mel Powell: for str qrt (1959).
- La fille aux cheveux de lin** → *Préludes* (Debussy, vol.1/8).
- La fille coupable** [Fr for The guilty girl] Boieldieu: comic opera (1st) 2a (1793); arranged for orch as ballet *La fille mal gardée* (The unchaperoned girl) by Damase.
- La fille de Madame Angot** [Fr for Madame Angot's daughter, char in novel *Madame Angot, ou La poissarde parvenue* (Madame Angot, or the upstart fishwife) (1796) by *Ève] Lecocq: operetta 3a (1872), lib by *Clairville + Siraudin + Koning; → *Mam'zelle Angot*.
- La fille du Far West** → (Ital) *fanciulla del West*.
- La fille du régime** → (Ital) *figlia del reggimento*.
- La fille du tambour-major** [Fr for The drum major's daughter] Offenbach: operetta 3a (4sc) (1879), lib by *Chivot + *Duru; → *Offenbachiana* (n.3).
- La fille mal gardée** [Fr for The unchaperoned girl, or The wavered girl] Hérold: ballet 2a (3sc) (1828), lib by Dauberval + *Aumer, based on medley of Fr popular songs; revised with music arrangement by *Lanchbery (1960), choreog by *Ashton.
- Filling Station** [based on a newspaper report] Thomson: ballet 1a (1938), lib by *Kirstein, choreog by *Christensen.
- Film en miniature** [Fr for Film in miniature] Martinů: suite of 6 pieces for piano, H148 (1925); 1. Tango; 2. Scherzo; 3. Ukleebavka (Berceuse); 4. Valse; 5. Chanson; 6. Carillon.
- Il filosofo di campagna** [Ital for The country philosopher] Galuppi: opera (dramma giocoso) 3a (1754), lib by *Goldoni.
- Le fils des étoiles** [Fr for The son of the stars] Satie: stage music 3a (1891); 1. La vocation; 2. L'initiation; 3. L'incantation.
- Le fils prodigue** → *enfant prodigue* + *Parables for Church Performance* (n.3).
- Le fils rival** [Fr for The rival son] Bortnyansky: subtitle *La moderne Stratonice*, comic opera 3a (1787), lib by *Lafermière.
- Filumena** [based on life of Ital immigrant to Canada Filumena Lassandro (1901-1923)] Estacio: opera 2a (2003), lib by *Murrell.
- Final** [Fr for Finale] C Franck: for organ, in B♭, op.21, M33 (1860-62).
- The Final Alice** [based on story *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* (1865) by *Carroll] Del Tredici: for soprano + choir + orch (1976); incl *Acrostic Song* (+ arranged for flute + piano).
- The Final Ingredient** [novel (1959) by R Rose] Amram: opera (2nd) 1a (1965), lib by *Weinstein.
- La fin du jour** [Fr for The end of the day] ballet 1a (1979), based on music from conc for piano + orch in G by Ravel, choreog by K *MacMillan; → *In G Major*.
- fin du temps** → *Quatuor pour la fin du temps*.
- Fine and Dandy** [with a happy ending] Swift: musical 2a (1930); incl songs *Can This Be Love?* + *Can't We Be Friends?*
- Fingal's Cave** [site in the islands of the Hebrides (Scotland); → *Hebridean Symphony*] Mendelssohn: Ger title *Fingals Höhle*, aka *The Hebrides Overture* (Ger title *Die Hebriden*), original title *Die einsame Insel* (The solitary island), ov, in b, op.26 (1830-32).
